He has presented excellent sermons, as well as book and Bible studies from his broad base of knowledge. He will be leaving us soon, having prepared us to welcome the permanent Pastor and Head of Staff to whom we have been led.

We wouldn't want Dave to leave without our also mentioning some really special things he has done that many of us never saw. For the most part, only those who experienced his compassion, generosity, and assistance, or those who assisted his efforts, ever knew of the following:

- ◆ Week after week compassionate intervention in many transient or crisis situations. Has fed, clothed and transported to shelter, several on-foot transients; one had spent the prior night sleeping in the Bona Dea gazebo in near zero weather.
- ◆ Several hours of sensitive, yet very professional and practical counseling of emotionally disturbed individuals.
- ◆ "Random acts of kindness" to strangers and members alike.
- ◆ Meaningful counsel to the bereaved.
- ◆ Hundreds of miles and trips to visit the homebound and hospitalized here and in Little Rock, often on "his own" time.
- ◆ Discreet help for congregation members in distress.
- ◆ Is among the first to donate sizable quantities of items for Main Street Mission, The Salvation Army, John's Kids, Christmas Food Baskets, Easter toys.
- ◆ Unfailing assistance as a resource for the Mission Study Team and PNC through book studies and general information he knew would be needed.
- ◆ And...he can cook too. Has cooked for Meal Mission and has been a big help to Eric with the UCM luncheons, albeit, with the assistance of our office angel.
- ◆ Traveled 270 miles round trip on his day off to provide counseling to a young couple.
- ◆ Participated in a CARTI cancer benefit bike run, representing our church, and in the process, helped an unappreciative snapping turtle move off the road out of harm's way.
- ◆ Helped our Property Committee and custodian, Jack, hang new fluorescent fixtures in classrooms and meeting rooms.
- ◆ Gave many hours as a volunteer and as chairman of The Salvation Army Board.
- ◆ And there have been beautiful notes to him of support and heartfelt thanks, notes that we most likely will never see.

We thank God for sending you to us, Dave. As you prepare to leave us, we wish for you your heart's desire. There is no way that we will ever forget you; please keep us always in your heart's memory as your good friends.
